Water Law Basics

Biography:

Jennifer Gimbel is a Senior Water Policy Scholar at the Colorado Water Institute. Her research currently focuses on Colorado River issues, with an emphasis on the Upper Basin. She spent three years in Washington D.C., where she was the Principal Deputy Assistant Secretary for Water & Science at the Department of the Interior, overseeing the U.S. Geological Survey and Bureau of Reclamation. She also was Deputy Commissioner for the Bureau of Reclamation and Counselor to the Assistant Secretary. Before going to Washington D.C., Jennifer was the Director of the Colorado Water Conservation Board. She has over 30 years of experience related to water resource issues.

This class will focus on the basics of Colorado water law, including how to obtain an appropriation and water right, types of water rights, water rights administration, and examples of how priorities work on a river.
