Biography:

Jennifer Gimbel is a Senior Water Policy Scholar at the Colorado Water Institute. Her research currently focuses on Colorado River issues, with an emphasis on the Upper Basin. She spent three years in Washington D.C., where she was the Principal Deputy Assistant Secretary for Water & Science at the Department of the Interior, overseeing the U.S. Geological Survey and Bureau of Reclamation. She also was Deputy Commissioner for the Bureau of Reclamation and Counselor to the Assistant Secretary. Before going to Washington D.C., Gimbel was the Director of the Colorado Water Conservation Board. She has over 30 years of experience related to water resource issues.



Abstract:

This class will focus on how federal law interacts with state law. The lecture will cover federal water rules for the United States and will review the role of federal and state entities in Colorado water law issues.
